First and foremost the Church and Christian Education Building have been paid for many years ago, we even had a mortgage burning ceremony when we paid off the church. I don't know the exact year but the mortgage on the C. E. Building was also paid off. When we decided to install an elevator in the church, we had a drive and it was paid for in it's entirety. As the buildings, etc. need repairs we pay as we go often with people giving to the project if it is huge. Of course like everyone else we have our usual monthly bills such as water, electricity, telephone and so forth.

The Pastor Nominating Committee has been very busy with their job and has asked Rev. Janet Riley to preach on Sunday, May 1, 2011. The committee feels she will be a good fit for ESPC as does the Committee on Ministry. It is a twenty hour a week job, she is willing to do what the church has designated in their Church Information Form. She will continue at Salem Presbyterian Church also. Our church service will have to be changed to 9:30 am (no big deal). We have met with Janet and the Session at Salem and feel this can work to everyone's advantage. Janet will most likely be working at the Spaghetti Supper come meet her, if you haven't already.

Lastly, the Alton Area Presbyterian Churches worked on a Mission Project in February for Haiti. They had had an earthquake and an outbreak of cholera. We had a worship service and a visit by Skype with Mark Hare, who works in Haiti with the people. This was followed by a Haiti meal of beans and rice, cinnamon cakes and salad and fellowship with others. We collected \$1,526.50 to help them. Thanks to all who helped on the committee and attended.

#### CRISIS FOOD CENTER REPORT

ESPC sent over 133 items to the Crisis Food Center since reported in our last newsletter. We have received several letters from the CFC thanking us for our donations. In 2010 they provided food for 23,486 people in 8,681 families. 754 families came to the center for the very first time. They were closed for a total of 8 days. In January and February 430 more people came to see them than came last year at the same time. Easter is coming extra food will be needed as well as money for hams. They are announcing a new way to help them with out costing you a thing. They have registered with "GoodSearch.com" The search engine partners with non-profits all over the country. Every time someone searches the web for their site, the participating non-profit receives \$.01. That does not seem like a lot but pennies add up. If you would like to participate, log on to www.goodsearch.com, choose "Crisis Food Center (Alton) in the "who do you good search for" box and that's it. Every time you use Good Search they receive a penny.
